The Chairman welcomed Members and visitors to the meeting.

1 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

CCCllr P.Phillips, CCCllr N.Plummer, KDCllr Mrs J.Haycock, Cllr J.Buxton, Cllr Mrs J.Lackner, Cllr Mrs S.Swift, WPC A.Butcher and PCSO M.Mitchell sent their apologies for absence.

2 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

Cllr Mrs Lay proposed, Cllr Boase seconded (Cllr van den Berg and Cllr Mrs Mitchell who were absent from the last meeting abstained) all others in favour that the minutes of the Ordinary Parish Meeting held on Monday June 9, 2008 are a true record and the Chairman signed them as such.

3 MATTERS ARISING AND NOT COVERED ELSEWHERE IN THIS AGENDA

There were no matters arising which were not covered in this agenda.

4 COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLORS' COMMENTS

KDCllr Mrs Taylor stated that

- proposed Post Office closures have been made an agenda item for Kerrier District Council's meeting on Wednesday
- the Implementation Executive's revised submission to the Boundary Committee makes provision for 123 Councillors in the new Unitary Authority. She noted that under these proposals the Parish of Wendron will regain its integrity

KDCllr Clayton reported that

- it will be some two weeks before the result of the Implementation Executive's submission is known: if the Boundary Committee is minded to accept it, then further public consultation will follow. If not, then by default, the new Authority will consist of 82 members
- the right of Town and Parish Councils within Kerrier to ask for Planning Applications to be decided by Committee has been revoked and District Councillors must now make that request
- although Kerrier District Council will retain its sovereignty until April 2009, the harsh reality is that more and more decisions are being taken at County level. Indeed Kerrier is having difficulties maintaining its mandatory duties
- Wendron, as one of the largest Parishes, both in terms of area and population, could have an influential voice in the Community Network once it exists. He urged members to make every effort to seize the opportunity (when it arises) to become engaged in the Area Committee

• although Central Government has indicated a preference for devolved government the reality is that it is unlikely to happen: the most likely scenario is that Town and Parish Councils will have an opportunity to become an agent of the Unitary Authority but the Unitary Authority will retin the power.

5 POLICE REPORT

Through the Clerk PCSO Mitchell reported that in the period from May 19 to July 21 there have been eight recorded crimes: two of burglary, two of criminal damage, two thefts from vehicles, one interference with a vehicle and one case of drink driving. Both he and WPC Butcher are continuing to address the problem of speeding vehicles, particularly near Wendron and Halwin schools

7 CARNKIE PLAY AREA

The Clerk reported that Awards for All has again returned the application for funding the Rotaweb with requests for further information and that this is in the process of being dealt with. There had been no reply from the Cory Environmental Trust.

8 PROJECTS WITHIN THE PARISH

Wendron Walks booklets – The Clerk reported that Mr Scolding suggests that, once a path is clear and waymarked, he should be contacted with a view to making the first of at least two walks. In the meanwhile, because Cornwall's work on the Public Paths Improvement Plan has been delayed, he has contacted Awards for All with a view to extending the finishing date to July 31, 2009.

Provision of a Parish Noticeboard at Trevenan Bal – the Clerk reported that Mr Salkeld is waiting for safety glass to complete the project. Nevertheless he, Mr Salkeld, is confident that the noticeboard will be completed and in position before the end of the week.

Bus shelter at Edgcumbe – the Clerk reported that, is is still awaiting replies from Utility Companies concerning the possibility of cables and pipes being buried beneath the verge.

Bus shelter maintenance – the Clerk reported that Martin Froggatt has said he will be starting with the necessary work in the near future.

Cllr Mrs Warren declared a personal and prejudicial interest in the following matter in that the quotation was supplied by Richard Warren, her son.

Cllr Mrs Warren relinquished the Chair and left the room.

The Vice-Chairman, Cllr Hamilton, assumed the chair.

Calvadnack Hut Circles – having received a quotation in a maximum sum of £280 from Richard Warren, members considered the future maintenance of this open area. It was proposed by Cllr Mrs Moyle, seconded by Cllr Gibson, Cllr van den Berg abstaining, all others in favour that Richard Warren should be instructed to clear the area around the hut circles. The Clerk reported that Allianz Insurance had confirmed that the Parish Council would be insured under the Public Liability scheme if it were to undertake this work.

The Vice Chairman proposed and it was agreed to discuss the following two items while the Chairman was out of the room, because her personal and prejudicial interest in each of them was the same.

Trinity Close fencing

The Clerk reported that he had received three quotations for the work to be done at Trinity Close and at Penmarth. He advised that even though part of the work might be considered to be a Health and Safety matter no decision should be made because it was not an agenda item. Cllr Hamilton proposed and it was agreed to include this item in the next agenda.
