#### 1 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

PC Vaughan and PCSO Sadler sent their apologies for absence.

# 2 CONFIRMATION OF THE ACCURACY OF THE MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Cllr Mrs Warren proposed, Cllr Mrs Mitchell seconded, (Cllr Clayton, Cllr Davidson and Cllr Mrs Moyle who were absent abstained) all others in favour that the minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on Monday May 9, 2011 are a true record and the Chairman signed them as being accurate.

# 3 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING

Cllr Mrs Lay proposed, Cllr Mrs Mitchell seconded, (Cllr Clayton, Cllr Davidson and Cllr Mrs Moyle who were absent abstained) all others in favour that the minutes of the Annual Meeting held on Monday May 9, 2011 are a true record and the Chairman signed them as such.

#### 4 MATTERS ARISING AND NOT COVERED ELSEWHERE IN THIS AGENDA

Considerable discussion arose concerning the legality both of the meetings held during the course of the last year and therefore the legality of the decisions made in them. It was alleged both that proper notice had not been given, (in that agendas were not published three clear working days before the meeting) and that additional items, particularly the payment of certain invoices, had been added to the agenda without proper notice. The Clerk stated firmly that on both counts, Wendron Parish Council had acted within the law, that proper notice of meetings constitutes three clear days (and not three clear working days) and further that the Chairman can propose that a matter is urgent and that, if it is agreed, then a decision can be made. Cllr Gibson proposed, Cllr Clayton seconded that those invoices appearing on the Additional Items List should not be paid this month. An amendment proposed by Cllr van den Berg, seconded by Cllr Mrs Warren, Cllr Mitchell abstaining, that those invoices appearing on the Additional Items List should be paid this month, but that in future they would not be paid unless they had appeared on the formal agenda was carried. The original proposal was therefore lost. The Clerk was asked to inform those contractors working for the Council that only invoices received by the end of the month preceding the meeting would be considered for payment. It was noted that this matter had not been on the agenda for the meeting.

# 5 CORNWALL COUNCILLOR'S COMMENTS

CCllr Clayton reported that

- the initial findings of the Local Needs Affordable Housing Survey are now available
- he commended the Clerk on the survey and commented that 42% of the questionnaires had been returned

- he understood that an Affordable Housing Officer will be attending the meeting in July
- he expects that that Officer will give an in-depth evaluation of the survey (which identifies 26 people in immediate need), will speak about the type of Affordable Local Needs Housing required in the Parish and will identify the land which has been offered
- it will then be up to the Parish Council to progress the matter
- if the Parish Council decides to go ahead, careful evaluation of the sites on offer will follow
- once three or four suitable sites have been identified, the Community as a whole will be given the opportunity to become involved
- he hoped members would be supportive of moving from words to deeds
- the Localism Bill will abolish the Standards Board for England and therefore the Code of Conduct. Misdemeanours which are presently punished with a 'slap on the wrist' will become a criminal offence. However, it appears that the law will only apply to the Unitary Authority: Town and Parish Councils will be exempt
- he has concerns about the rôle of the Parish Council as a Statutory Consultee in planning matters. He does not believe that at present the Planning Authority gives the Parish Council all the information it requires to make valid comment. He also believes that contrary decisions should be properly explained by the Officer concerned. He reminded members that in the event of the Parish Council offering a recommendation contrary to the decision of the case officer it is he, as the Ward Member, who will make the decision whether or not to insist that the application is decided by the Planning Committee
- Enforcement Officers have given the owners of the mobile home at Gardenia, Rame Common a further six months to remove it from the land
- Enforcement Officers are seeking a formal application for the commercial use of a residential property in Carnkie.

It was agreed to add the rôle of the Parish Council as a Statutory Consultee in planning matters to the agenda for the July meeting.

#### 6 POLICE REPORT

Through the Clerk, PC Vaughan reported that, in May 2011, no crimes had been reported to the Police: this compares with seven reported crimes in May 2010.

#### 7 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

There were no members of the public present.

#### 8 PARISH COUNCIL MATTERS

#### The co-option of Parish Councillors

The Clerk reported that no applications for co-option onto the Parish Council have been received.

#### 9 PROJECTS WITHIN THE PARISH

#### **Bases for Speed Visors in Rame and Carnkie**

The Clerk reported that, as requested, he had enquired about the costs relating to solar and conventional powered Vehicle Activated Signs. Although the cost of installing a single sign would be considerably cheaper if it were solar powered, the array would be too delicate to permit it to be transported between the proposed two sites. It was agreed that the original proposal should be pursued without further delay.

# Mugs commemorating the wedding of HRH Prince William and Catherine Middleton

The Chairman reported that, just before their half-term holiday and on behalf of Wendron Parish Council, she and Cllr Mrs Warren had presented mugs commemorating the wedding of HRH Prince William and Catherine Middleton on April 29, 2011 to the children of Wendron School. She further reported that she had presented similar mugs to the children of Halwin School (each of the mugs had had a Parish Information and News brochure placed inside it).

#### **Local Needs Housing Survey**

The Clerk had sent members a report on the findings of the recent Local Needs Affordable Housing Survey which had been prepared by Cornwall's Affordable Housing Team. CCllr Clayton had already spoken about his preferred way forward.

#### 10 FINANCE

The Clerk presented Councillors with a statement of Wendron Parish Council's financial position as at June 13, 2011. A copy of that statement is attached to these minutes.

Members considered a request from Tanya's Courage Trust for help with funding. Following discussion, it was agreed that Wendron Parish Council cannot support this cause.
