Minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of Wendron Parish Council held on Monday July 11, 2011 at 7:30pm in Edgcumbe Methodist Church Schoolroom.

Visitors: Mr W.Morris (CC Affordable Housing Officer), PCSO Sadler.

The Chairman welcomed visitors and members to the July meeting. She introduced Mr Will Morris (CC Affordable Housing Officer) and invited him to address the Council.

Speaking of the recently completed Housing Needs Survey, Mr Morris said that the large number of completed forms returned had been very encouraging. The findings demonstrate a clear need for affordable homes and broad support for a scheme or schemes with a marked preference for small developments scattered around the Parish. It is now the Parish Council's decision whether or not to proceed. If it does decide to take matters further, possibly the best way forward is for an informal sub-committee to examine possibilities and report back to the full Council. Mr Morris stressed that all the decisions relating to development (decisions relating to design, materials, planning gains, even about the sites themselves) were for the Parish Council and not Cornwall Council to make. He reminded Members that Cornwall Council has already advertised for potential sites and that a number of landowners within the parish of Wendron have indicated an interest. In answer to questions he

- stated that the time span for development was for the Parish Council to agree, although he added that he believes it important to keep momentum going
- stated that a development can be on green or brown field and can be used to remove a blight, though he expressed concern about differences in land values
- stated that he did not know whether or not the homes shown in the weekly HomeChoice Newsletter are being taken up
- acknowledged that mortgage providers currently have a problem with S106 agreements
- said that any scheme should be tailored to those in need. Affordable homes may be rented, purchased, shared equity or self-built.

Speaking on behalf of the Council, the Chairman thanked Mr Morris for attending the meeting and for speaking so informatively and he left the room.

### 1 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Cllr Clayton sent his apologies for absence.

### 2 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

Cllr Mrs Lay proposed, Cllr Mrs Warren seconded, all others in favour that the minutes of the Meeting held on Monday June 13, 2011 are a true record and the Chairman signed them as such.

PCSO Sadler reported that two crimes (one of criminal damage and the other of possession of drugs) had been reported to the Police in June 2011, which compares favourably to the seven crimes that were reported in the same period last year.

#### 7 PARISH COUNCIL MATTERS

### The co-option of Parish Councillors

The Clerk reported that no applications for co-option onto the Parish Council have been received.

#### 8 PROJECTS WITHIN THE PARISH

### **Bases for Speed Visors in Rame and Carnkie**

The Clerk reported that he had no further information concerning the installation of bases for the Vehicle Activated Sign in Rame/Edgecumbe. He agreed to pursue the matter with Cornwall Highways.

## **Local Needs Housing Survey**

The Chairman proposed and it was agreed that the informal committee consisting of Cllr Mrs Mitchell, Cllr Mrs Warren, the Chairman and the Clerk should meet within the next fortnight to draw up a list of questions and proposals to present to the meeting in August.

## Diamond Jubilee of HM Queen Elizabeth II

Members considered the purchase of trees to commemorate the Diamond Jubilee of HM Queen Elizabeth II. It was suggested that trees might be planted in the lay-by at the southern end of Underlane, in the grounds of each of the schools, on the green at Carnmenellis and possibly along the road between Wendron and Trenear. This work should be done in the late autumn and commemorative plaques might be purchased for the schools.

# **Mining World Heritage Site**

Members considered the purchase of signage which would mark the boundary of the Mining World Heritage Site. The Clerk reported that David Pascoe at Trannack Quarries had given a rough estimate for each milestone sized stone in the sum of £450. It was agreed to seek funding for this project before proceeding any further and, in the meanwhile, to speak to Cornwall Highways about positioning such signage on the verge of the B3297.

#### A notice-board at Rame

Members considered the purchase of a notice-board to be sited at Rame. Cllr Mitchell reported that the owner of the Post Office had agreed that a board might be attached to the wall of the shop behind where the telephone box stands (the box is to be removed shortly). The Clerk was asked to investigate funding.

# 9 FINANCE

The Clerk presented Councillors with a statement of Wendron Parish Council's financial position as at June 13, 2011. A copy of that statement is attached to these minutes.

The Clerk asked members to consider, exceptionally, paying an invoice from Frederic Wearne and Sons for the cleaning and repainting of the War Memorial. He pointed out that this expense had been authorised in December 2010. Following discussion, Cllr Mrs Lay proposed, Cllr Mrs Mitchell seconded, Cllr Gibson abstained, all others in favour, exceptionally to pay this invoice.
