1 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Cllr Davidson, Cllr van den Berg and PCSO Whitford all sent apologies for their absence.

3 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETINGS

Cllr Mitchell proposed, Cllr Mrs Hook seconded, (Cllr Miss Nute and Cllr Tremayne, who were absent from the last Meeting, abstained) all others in favour that the minutes of the Ordinary Meeting held on Monday August 12, 2013 are a true record and the Chairman signed them as such.

4 MATTERS ARISING AND NOT COVERED ELSEWHERE IN THIS AGENDA

The Clerk reported that Chown China's mug commemorating the birth of Prince George of Cambridge will each cost the Council £4.05. It was agreed that the matter should be discussed at the next meeting.

5 CORNWALL COUNCILLOR'S COMMENTS

CCllr Dr Jenkin reported that, since the last meeting, she has attended

- both the consultation meeting at Edgcumbe concerning the proposed additional solar farm and
- the consultation meeting at Four Lanes concerning the proposed wind turbine at Lancarrow
- a site meeting with the planning officer concerned at Mono Construction, Rame Cross
- a budget briefing meeting at Cornwall Council (she again warned members of stringent cost-cutting measures as a result of ever-diminishing funding grants from Central Government)
- the Gorsedd at Penryn.

Additionally, she has toured the area with a Highways Officer and identified a number of issues which either have

been or will be resolved: has been involved in the Helston Museum change-over (both a curator and an assistant are now in place and there are plans to open the museum in the afternoon): and, as part of *Safer Cornwall*, has been involved in the launch of the *Say No to Hate* campaign.

In answer to questions, she confirmed that, other than for the collection of garden waste and as a general rule, Cornwall Council does not have the facilities for handling wheelie-bins: that a spread sheet showing the cost of cutting roadside verges in the Parish has been promised and that a new Penmarth sign is being printed and will be put up once it is ready.

6 POLICE REPORT

Through the Clerk, PCSO Whitford reported that three crimes (a theft, a burglary and a Public Order offence) were reported to the police in August. He warned residents that the police will be proactive in pursuing traffic issues during September.

7 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

In respect of the planning application for the construction of a 5kW wind turbine (PA13/07330), Mr Ross stated that he is trying to make his small-holding as green as possible and the introduction of this turbine combined with the already-installed solar panels will mean that his use of oil will diminish to the point of being negligible. Near neighbours have raised no objection, there are no issues with bats and the pylon will not be visible on the sky-line.

Speaking on behalf of the Porkellis Moor Rowing Club (which had applied for help with funding the cost of a set of Junior light-weight oars), Mr Oliver said that the Club had been formed in June; that it was inclusive (welcoming equally, for example, young people and the *Blind at Sea*), offers taster sessions on Stithians Lake where a plastic gig is in use (a wooden gig is used on the sea) and is generally very active. The Club raises funds through open evenings and quiz nights and will be entering a crew to row in next year's World Championships in Scilly.

8 PARISH MATTERS

The purchase and future location of a defibrillator

The Clerk reported that he had contacted Wendron Cricket Club with a view to seeking a contribution towards the cost of a defibrillator, but that had not been forthcoming. He added, however, that the Club would take responsibility for its care, maintenance and insurance. He drew members' attention to the South Western Ambulance Service Community Public Access Defibrillator scheme which both supplies a defibrillator and offers a full support package for a one-off payment of £1,500 – an internal cabinet (which will protect the instrument) is also on offer for a further £200 + VAT. Following discussion, Cllr Miss Nute proposed, Cllr Mrs Warren seconded all others in favour that Wendron Parish Council should purchase and install a defibrillator at Wendron Cricket Club through the South Western Ambulance Service scheme.

The purchase of a notice-board for Edgcumbe

The Clerk reported that he has heard nothing more and will contact Bear Joinery.

The repair or replacement of the gate into Wendron cemetery

The Clerk reported that it is his understanding that Mr Tristan Kessell has started work on the replica gate for the cemetery at Wendron.

The repair of the lane up to the Village Hall in Carnkie

The Clerk reported that an opportunity to obtain some road planings from Cornwall Highways for the repair of this lane had arisen and that, in consultation with the Chairman, he had asked Rex Andrew to lay them. The Parish Council has already been thanked by individual users of the Carnkie Wendron Village Hall. He further reported that he has asked Mr Gareth Mitchell to clear out the drainage ditch to the side.

9 PARISH COUNCIL MATTERS

Co-option of Councillors

The Clerk reported that he had received no expressions of interest in standing for co-option as a Parish Councillor.

The A394 through Trewennack

Members considered the appointment of two Councillors to collate information which may assist any decision on road improvements on the A394 through Trewennack. Following a short discussion, Cllr van den Berg and Cllr Mrs Mitchell were appointed to take on this work.

10 FINANCE

The Clerk presented Councillors with a statement of Wendron Parish Council's financial position as at September 9, 2013. A copy of that statement is attached to these minutes.

Members considered an invitation to renew the subscription to the *Clerks and Councils Direct Newsletter* in the sum of £12.00 Cllr Mrs Warren proposed, Cllr Mrs Mitchell seconded and it was agreed to purchase a single subscription to the *Clerks and Councils Direct Newsletter* for the coming year at a cost of £12.00.

Members considered making a donation from the Community Benefit grant (which was made to Wendron Parish Council following the completion of the solar farm at Edgcumbe) to Constantine Parish Council, which is similarly affected by its visual impact on the rural landscape. Following discussion, Cllr Miss Nute proposed, Cllr Mrs Hook seconded all in favour that such a grant would be inappropriate.

Members considered a request from Cruse Bereavement Care in Cornwall for financial help with support for bereaved people. Following discussion, Cllr Mrs Moyle proposed, Cllr Mitchell seconded and it was agreed that Wendron Parish Council should forward the sum of £50 to Cruse Bereavement Care in Cornwall under the terms of Section 142(2A) of the Local Government Act 1972.

Members considered a request from Wendron Cricket Club for financial help towards the cost of a new stand with associated solar power panels. Following discussion, it was proposed by Cllr Mrs Moyle, seconded by Cllr Mrs Warren, all others in favour that the sum of £2,000.00 should be made available to the Club under the terms of Section 19 (3a) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976. The grant to be paid once an assurance that full funding is in place and that the project will proceed to completion has been received.

Members considered a request from Porkellis Moor Rowing Club for financial help towards the cost of a new pair of junior lightweight oars. Following discussion, it was proposed by Cllr Gibson, seconded by Cllr Mrs Moyle, all others in favour that the sum of £200.00 be sent to the Club under the terms of Section 19 (3a) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976.

Cllr Mitchell again raised the question of the totally inappropriate and unacceptable use of speed through the communities of Rame and Edgcumbe and the disappointment felt by residents that Cornwall Council had ignored their request for a lower speed limit. CCllr Dr Jenkin undertook to look into this matter and suggested that Wendron Parish Council might consider contributing to the cost of any necessary legislation.

Cllr Mitchell reported that a resident of Carnkie had asked him to suggest that signs warning drivers of children and older people should be placed at the gateways to Penmarth.
