4 MATTERS ARISING AND NOT COVERED ELSEWHERE IN THIS AGENDA

The Chairman reported that three tractor tyres and a car tyre had been dumped at the bottom of the Rame Hill. The Clerk agreed to report this.

5 CORNWALL COUNCILLOR'S COMMENTS

CCllr Dr Jenkin reported that

- she had spoken to Highways about the rain-water run-off from the road at Tyack's Shaft on to PROW 157 and it had been agreed that a little ridge would overcome this problem. The necessary work will be done in the not too distant future
- the pipe carrying the Cober under Lezerea Lane has become blocked: Highways will also deal with this
- she had spoken with Enforcement Officers about a number of issues relating to unauthorised development in the open countryside
- as a member of the Health and Social Care Scrutiny Committee, she is involved in the proposals relating to the Accountable Care System and, in particular, its governance and democratic accountability

8 PARISH MATTERS

Telephone Kiosks

Cllr Ferris reported that he had placed a notice concerning the future use of the now-disconnected telephone box in Burras in the kiosk itself, but had heard nothing. Members agreed that this matter should again be considered at the meeting in February.

Highways and Public Rights of Way

Members noted that problems with the following PROWs 2, 6, 19, 29, 72, 104, 138 and 157 (all which have been identified by the Wendron Bridleways Association) have been reported to Cornwall Council and that the Officer concerned has agreed to report back on her findings.

The Clerk reported that the PROW and Open Space maintenance contracts are due for renewal and it was agreed that invitations to quote should be forwarded to contractors with a request for a quotations to be forwarded by February 9 – in time for consideration at the next meeting.

Cllr Durkin stated that a West Cornwall group of walkers had told him that they never use the PROWs in Wendron because they are so badly maintained and added that the Carrick group of the Ramblers' Association (of which he is a member) has not arranged a walk within the Parish during the coming six months for the same reason. Cllr Mrs Hampton stated that she too had heard walkers criticising the state of the PROWs within the Parish. Both the Clerk and a member stated firmly that, with relatively few exceptions, Wendron's PROWs are well kept and are open for use. The Clerk praised the work done on the PROWs by Bob Sanders over a number of years, adding that Miss Mary Weston of the Ramblers' Association had, on a number of occasions, congratulated Wendron Parish council on the way it keeps its paths.

Members noted that in the recent freezing weather the road between Halwin and Rame was very icy and therefore slippery and dangerous. The Clerk was asked to report the matter to Cornwall Highways and ask for the road to be gritted in icy weather.

9 FINANCE
